All entries must incorporate the theme.

FLOAT REQUIREMENTS:

1. Basic dimensions for floats (strictly enforced):
Maximum length: Limit of three vehicles/units per entry
2. A float can be self-propelled, a towed trailer or flatbed truck.
3. All floats must be entirely decorated. If not, they will be rejected and not allowed to participate in the parade.
4. Float operator/driver must have a valid driver's license, and be a competent operator/driver.
5. We insist that all motorized vehicles are in good repair with good brakes.

INSURANCE:

Motorized entrants must provide a certificate of commercial general liability of not less than one million aggregate limit covering bodily injury, death and property damage to any number of persons or property in any one occurrence. **The certificate shall name the Rotary Club of Sault Ste. Marie as additional insured.** It must be submitted with the application.

DRIVERS:

All drivers of vehicles in the parade may be required to attend a pre-parade meeting. Information will be forthcoming.

HUMAN-POWERED (KINETIC) SCULPTURES:

It's said the bicycle is man's most perfect invention. So how do you improve upon perfection? By turning it into an art project and entering it in a parade, of course. *What are kinetic sculptures?* Essentially, "human-powered vehicles with artistic themes." Basically,

you grab a bike (or two or three) weld it together into a creative contraption and hope that you make it to the end of the parade route. For inspiration, just type in "kinetic sculptures" or "human powered sculptures" into Google on the internet.

MOTORIZED ENTRY USING GREEN ENERGY:

1. Energy source to power the entry must be solar, electric, hydrogen or wind.
2. Entry will also be judged on originality, quality, use of theme, and overall appearance.

PARADE RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Absolutely nothing is to be thrown or handed out to the spectators from the floats or cars. Your participants walking along the road may hand out candies, etc. giving directly to the crowd. All handouts that are written materials must be approved by the Parade Steering Committee. Include a sample with the application form.
2. All persons participating in the parade must be in costume or uniform.
3. No livestock, equestrians, domestic animals, birds or reptiles are acceptable as entries or as parts of entries without written approval of the Parade Steering Committee. Certificate of insurance is required for approved units.
4. Use of any political sign, social or political material or improper use of the Canadian flag is not permitted.
5. Parade entries must follow the directions of parade officials. Parade participants must keep pace with the line of march. All units must maintain forward motion during the parade. Gaps are not allowed to occur. (*Official parade spacing is 60 feet between entries and must be maintained.*)
6. Alcoholic beverages and other controlled substances are forbidden on any float, in any vehicle or on the person of any participant. Participants who consume alcohol prior to parade start are not permitted to enter the line of march, and people who use alcohol or other controlled substances during the parade are removed.
7. Smoking is not permitted.

LINE-UP:

- Proceed to Churchill Blvd.
- Proceed south on Churchill Blvd. to Queen St. East
- A Rotarian at the intersection of Queen St. East will direct you westerly on Queen St. to your numbered stake.

START TIME: Judging at 10:00 AM. Be in position by 10:00 AM, 17 July 2010. **PARADE WILL START AT 11:00 AM SHARP!!!**

JUDGING:

The Sault Ste. Marie Kiwanis Club will begin judging at 10:00 AM.

TELEVISION BROADCAST: A television crew will be set up by the Essar Centre. Please slow down prior to Bruce St. so that the hosts will have time to talk about your entry. If your entry has a performance component, please make sure to perform while in front of the camera. **NO HORN BLOWING or sirens one-half block prior, while in front of, and one-half block after the cameras.**

PARADE ROUTE:

The parade will proceed westerly on Queen St. to Gore St.

DISPERSAL: The parade ends at Queen and Gore St. Large floats will turn left on Bay St. and disperse along Bay St. Bands will disperse in Esposito Park. We urge you to move along swiftly to help keep the parade moving. If the float participants have to be picked up, a suggested area would be Esposito Park. It is important to keep moving from the termination point to eliminate congestion and frustrating stoppages. **NO FLOATS WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF GORE AND QUEEN FOR DISPERSAL PURPOSES.**
